Naming the sessions (and summary/abstract) are crucial to getting attendees to consider / actually attend your session. EE 11 talk was well attended. Believe that it was based on topic/name/summary. Focus on how the technology can be used to solve problems. Emily concurs with the previous comments. As well, she pointed out that the Jakarta track seems to be placed in a far corner of the conference and there is lots of active competition for attendees. This may be a function of pre-conference feedback/sign-up or organizer expectations – Location, location, location. Perhaps consider salting EE talks into other tracks. Toward the end of the sessions, the number of competing talks diminished so attendance would likely go up. Also, no booths. End of the conference sessions had a built-in advantage. Will we get more details on sessions/attendance? Perhaps a list of most attended sessions so we can determine how to refine our content for the attendee matrix.
